Greetings from your Bridge Pastor! I'm glad that I've been called to be with you in this time of transition, as Immanuel and Lutheran-Episcopal Campus Ministry begin discerning whom to call next to this Word and Sacrament pastoral ministry.

We've all been living through an extended season of change the last year and a half, and as the pandemic persists, so will the season. I want to acknowledge this reality and the struggles we've endured to make it this far, because it's in that honesty that we find our true selves and our true need for God's gracious love in our lives.

In this ongoing pandemic season, I find myself drawn to some of those lynchpin Biblical stories of God's people dealing with struggle and change. The Exodus pops to mind, as does the Babylonian captivity. Moses and Miriam, Naomi and Ruth, Elijah and Elisha, Mary and Joseph, Paul and Peter—they all embarked on journeys that would change their lives forever. Though their stories each have different triumphs and tragedies, the constant presence and providence of God is the thread that runs through them all.

I'm drawn to the story of Naomi, who suffered multiple deaths in her family and was left with practically nothing. The one thing she still possessed, however, and the thing that would shape her life for years to come, was the love her daughter-in-law Ruth had for her. Ruth was determined that Naomi not journey alone into an uncertain and difficult future—Ruth would go with her, no matter what befell them both. Naomi's faith, you'll remember, was next to none, yet in the strength of Ruth's devoted love, she pressed onward and returned to Israel, where they were able to find a new and prosperous life through Ruth's marriage to Boaz.

Jesus brought God's devoted love for the world with Him in His incarnation. Jesus also brought the message that God's love is unchangeable, even during the most life-threatening changes.

I'm sure you've heard the old joke, "How many Lutherans does it take to change a lightbulb? Answer: None. Lutherans don't believe in change."

I confess that this joke sometimes cuts a little too close to my corn. But, here we are, together, in this season of change, discerning the Spirit's guidance into God's future. I look forward to getting to know you more, and you me, while we're journeying together. I look forward to gathering as a group around the Old, Old Story and finding those Spiritwoven, connective threads to our stories. And may we feel the power of God's devoted love for us as we travel into God's new. The Lord is with us.

Changes to Worship in September

Beginning Sunday, September 12, you will see changes made to our worship service. The Gathering Hymn and the reading of the Second Lesson will be added back into the service.

The Eucharistic Meal will be a bit different. The all-in-one juice and wafer cups will still be available in the pews, and a new way of continuous communion will also be an option. Wafers and wine/juice will be placed on a table near the end of the center aisle. Wafers will be in individual paper cups. Wine and juice will be in plastic cups widely spaced in the round communion trays.

Pastor Dan and the Assisting Minister will be at the table. Ushers will direct worshipers up the center aisle to the table. At Pastor Dan's direction/prompt ("This is the body of Christ – given for you"), take a paper cup with the wafer. At the direction/prompt of the Assisting Minister ("This is the blood of Christ – shed for you"), take a cup of wine or juice. Then place the empty paper and plastic cups in the receptacles provided and return to your seat by the side aisle.

If you choose to remain in the pew with the all-in-one cups, you may commune at your discretion and place the empty cup back in the pew tray as usual.

INSIDE, OUTSIDE, AND ONLINE WORSHIP

Note that our guidelines will evolve over time as restrictions increase or decrease. Thank you for your faithful flexibility as we worship our beloved Lord and Savior!

INSIDE

- Masks are optional. Please consider others as you make your choice.
- Practice social-distancing. Pews are marked to maintain this distance. Ushers will help to seat you and your family if needed.
- Bulletins and offering plates are there for you on the table inside.
- Singing and speaking should be done as softly as possible. Only the worship leaders sing and speak out.
- Communion cups/wafers are already set up in the pews. Put the used cups back in the wooden holder when you are finished.
- Inside worship is inevitably different than before the pandemic, you may want to view it as a more reflective time enjoyed in a beautiful, sacred space where you can listen, share in communion, and attend to God.

OUTSIDE

- Safer than inside worship, outside worship is a way of worshipping more closely with others while staying safe in your own car.
- An usher will provide you with a bulletin, communion elements and an offering box.
- Tune your radio to FM 90.9 to join in worship.

ONLINE

- Online worship is the safest, most convenient worship experience. It is recommended for the most vulnerable. Services are both live-streamed and recorded for use at a later time.
- If you wish to celebrate communion, prepare ahead of time bread or cracker, as well as juice or wine.
- Go to www.immanlutheran.org on your computer, smartphone, tablet, etc. to view or print the bulletin before watching the service. You may also request to have a paper bulletin mailed to you each week.


