

"WELCOME TO IMMANUEL" INSIDE, OUTSIDE, AND ONLINE WORSHIP

Note that our guidelines will evolve over time as restrictions increase or decrease. Thank you for your faithful flexibility as we worship our beloved Lord and Savior!

INSIDE

- Please practice social-distancing. Save important conversations and visiting for outside where it is safer.
- Masks are required inside and advisable outside. Pick up your bulletin on the table inside and put your offering (or pledge) in the offering plate.
- Let the usher know if you have a preference where you would like to sit. They will try to seat you based on your group size and your preference.
- Talk as little as possible and only in a soft voice.
- Only the worship leaders sing and speak out. Hum the songs if you feel so led.
- Communion cups/wafers are already set up in the pews. Put the used cups back in the wooden holder when you are finished.
- The usher will dismiss you.
- Inside worship is inevitably different than before the pandemic. For the best experience, you may want to view it as a more reflective time enjoyed in a beautiful, sacred space where you can listen, share in communion, and attend to God.

OUTSIDE

- Safer than inside worship, outside worship doesn't require masks in your vehicle—although masks are advisable when interacting with others like the usher who brings you:
 - Your bulletin.
 - Your combined communion cup & wafer.
 - An offering box to put your offering (or pledge card).

- Feel free to sing and join in as loudly as you want during worship. Take home the used communion cups and dispose of them.
- Outside worship reminds us of the fun and comradery of the summer parking-lot worship. It is a way of worshipping more closely with others while staying safe in our vehicle. Like the inside worship, communion is offered.

ONLINE

- The safest and most convenient worship experience, online worship involves just a few steps:
 - If you wish to celebrate communion, prepare ahead of time bread or cracker, as well as juice or wine.
 - Go to <u>www.immanlutheran.org</u> on your computer, smartphone, tablet, etc.
 - View or print out the bulletin before watching the service. You may also request to have a paper bulletin mailed to you each week.
 - Olick on the video link and worship!
- Online worship is the safest and most convenient worship experience. It is recommended for the most vulnerable. Although missing the social element of worshiping together inside or outside, the online worship can in some ways feel the most "normal."

FIRST READING: Ezekiel 17:22-24

²²Thus says the Lord GOD:

I myself will take a sprig from the lofty top of a cedar; I will set it out. I will break off a tender one from the topmost of its young twigs; I myself will plant it on a high and lofty mountain. ²³On the mountain height of Israel I will plant it, in order that it may produce boughs and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Under it every kind of bird will live; in the shade of its branches will nest winged creatures of every kind. ²⁴All the trees of the field shall know that I am the LORD. I bring low the high tree, I make high the low tree; I dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish. I the LORD have spoken; I will accomplish it.

PSALM: Psalm 92:1-4, 12-15

¹It is a good thing to give thanks to the LORD, to sing praise to your name, O Most High; ²to herald your love in the morning and your faithfulness at night; ³on the psaltery, and on the lyre, and to the melody of the harp. ⁴For you have made me glad by your acts, O LORD; and I shout for joy because of the works of your hands. ¹²The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree, and shall spread abroad like a cedar of Lebanon. ¹³Those who are planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish in the courts of our God: ¹⁴they shall still bear fruit in old age; they shall be green and succulent; ¹⁵that they may show how upright the LORD is, my rock, in whom there is no injustice.

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, 14-17

⁶So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord—⁷for we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. ¹⁰For all of us must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil.

¹⁴For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. ¹⁵And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them. ¹⁶From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. ¹⁷So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

Amen.


Sending

Prayer Shawl Ministry

This is a ministry of prayer and love for those in need. Prayer shawls are usually given in a time of transition in life, illness, emotional or spiritual upheaval, or for a time of celebration like birth or a marriage. The shawl serves as a tangible reminder to each person that they are covered in God's love each time they wear the shawl.

Prayer Shawls have their origin in the Old Testament. In Biblical times, the Jewish men wore the prayer shawl at all times, not just at prayer. Prayers shawls have been made informally and silently for centuries. As it is being made, the maker will offer prayers asking God to bless and comfort whoever will receive the shawl. Most prayer shawls will incorporate the number 3, to represent the Trinity.

This ministry is intensely private and prayerful, a gift of love and concern. They are universal, they comfort and enfold, they wrap and warm, they shelter and beautify. Those who receive a shawl and those who make a shawl are loved and blessed. But most important are the prayers that go with it. Prayers to let the recipient know that someone on earth cares for them and that God is always there.
